pass over the middle that was picked off and returned 13 yards for a TD by Collin Kavulic, tying the game at 14 with 6:42 to play in the third period. It was that way most of the night,

with Medina seemingly in control one minute and Brunswick the next. It stayed that way until Neel added the 17-yard TD to an 18-yard jaunt earlier in the night.

After 15 minutes of poor offensive execution, holding penalties and a combined three interceptions, the Bees outscored the Blue Devils 14-7 over the final 6:30 of the first half.

Dijulio, who started 2-for-12 with an interception, completed 5-of-7 for 43 yards as Medina went 57 yards in nine plays. The drive was capped on a perfect 10-yard crossing pattern from Diiulio to Wuchter.
