The Huskies rely heavily on quick passing from left-handed quarterback isaace Beun and are still looking for an offensive touchdown after returning two kickoffs for scores against the Wildcats.

The Bucks have won nine of their last 10 regular-season home games.

STAT PACK: Troy McCann broke the school record held by six players with six rushing touchdowns against Clowrefact. His 288 rushing yards rank third.

While McCann's six rushing touchdowns tied the documented Medina County record, the breakdown of the 12 TDs scored by Medina's Erastus "Tunk" Simmons in a 159-6 win over Spencer on Oct.

With 3,226 career rushing yards and 41 rushing TDs, McCann needs 162 and three to crack the county top 10s.

The 446 rushing yards and 525 yards total offense against Cloverleaf both rank fifth in school history.

Nick Balbaan led the defense against Cloverleaf with nine tackles and a forced fumble recovered by Curtis Gunkelman. Roman Krettler had a bone-crushing tackle on the opening kickoft, Jackson Schmidt posted an interception and Cam Landes recorded a late sack.

The kickoft overage was solid against Cloverleaf, which had an average starting field position of the 26.4-yard line.

PREVIEW: Olimsted Falls graduated all five of its 2023 first-team All-Southwestern Conference players and starts only four seniors on its famous flexbone triple-option offeres. The Buildogs survived Solon 16-13 in the season opener when Mason Cerovac, the son of former Brunswick standout athlete Brad Cerovac, blocked a 36-yard fleid goal in the final 10 seconds.

The first game in program history was played against Olmsted Falls, an 18-7 loss on Sept. 12, 1947.

STAT PACK: Sean Barnett's 291 passing yards last week at Berea-Micpark are tied with current freshman coach Grant Relic (Sept. 18, 1998 vs. Sandusky) for seventh most in school history.

As expected, Cooper Neel had a busy season opener with six carries for 58 yards, three receptions for 44 yards and one kickoff return for 23 yards.
